This past year has been transformative for the Eastern Oklahoma Library System. In FY25, we circulated 229,598 digital items and 662,322 physical materials, reflecting continued strong engagement across our service area. We proudly launched three renovation projects, delivered a record number of outreach programs, and strengthened our community through new partnerships and collaborations.

One of our most exciting milestones was the launch of the *Imagine More* campaign. This long-term initiative aims to

transform the Muskogee Public Library into a 21st-century community hub, featuring coworking spaces, enhanced children's areas, makerspaces, and an innovative genealogy center.


We are thankful to the City of Muskogee Foundation for its generous \$1.5 million seed donation toward the *Imagine More* campaign. We also extend our heartfelt thanks to the Muskogee voters who, on July 8, 2025, approved an additional \$1.1 million in a capital improvement investment.

Our new partnerships are examples of our commitment to collaboration. We are working with the Library of Congress on a pilot project to co-construct an interactive digital experience at the Muskogee Public Library. We are also collaborating with the Cherokee Nation to install distance learning equipment in five libraries for asynchronous Cherokee language classes. A grant from the Carolyn Watson Rural Oklahoma Community Foundation will further our mission by bringing adult literacy programs to five libraries.



Together, we will co-create two cutting-edge digital experiences designed to help communities in Eastern Oklahoma and Cleveland interact with digital library collections in new, dynamic ways that truly bring history and culture to life.

Facilities Updates:

In FY25, the Eastern Oklahoma Library System proudly launched a system-wide facilities update campaign to revitalize our library buildings. Thanks to the incredible collaboration with city staff, Friends of the Library groups, and the EOLS Board of Trustees, we successfully completed improvements at Eufaula Memorial Library, Rieger Memorial Library, and Q.B. Boydstun Library—creating brighter, more welcoming spaces for our communities to learn, connect, and grow. With a 9.07% increase in revenue last year, we are now well-positioned to extend these improvements to additional branches across our service area.






Total Revenue
